Colombia's **Ecopetrol** buys wind power project from Enel



BOGOTA, July 7 (Reuters) - Colombian state oil firm Ecopetrol (ECO.CN) 3 said on Monday it has purchased a wind power project in the northern province of La Guajira from Enel (ENEI.MI) [2].

The Windpeshi project will have capacity to produce 205 megawatts, "which will be immediately $incorporated\ into\ the\ {\color{red}\underline{Ecopetrol}}\ Group's\ self-consumption\ portfolio,"\ the\ company\ said\ in\ a\ statement.$
